

## **PART A – Application for Registration as a Provider Organisation of an Establishment or Agency**

### **Updated Guidance**

The Jersey Care Commission is in the process of undertaking a review of requirements made of both Providers and Trustees of a Regulated Activity. This follows feedback received from various stakeholders. As a result of this review, the Jersey Care Commission no longer requires a birth certificate or statement of medical fitness for individual members of a provider body. However, it does require valid photo ID, DBS certificate, references and a CV.

This requirement is borne out of the Regulation of Care (Standards and Requirements) (Jersey) Regulations 2018:

Regulation 2 (1) requires that the provider has the qualifications, skills, knowledge or experience necessary to provide the regulated activity. For this reason the Commission requires a CV.

Regulation 2 (2) includes a declaration about criminal convictions, investigations or pending court action. For this reason the Commission requires a DBS certificate.

In addition photographic ID is required. This should take the form of a passport or a driving licence.

Whilst two referees are required for applicants to the position of either Provider or Trustee, the Jersey Care Commission will undertake the sourcing of the references (rather than the applicant themselves).
